THANK YOU FOR VOLUNTEERING TO BE A MEMBER OF THE AMBASSADOR CLUB.

Our purpose is simply to support ACT as they fulfill their mission to provide a forum to improve business conditions for its members through united and cooperative action for the betterment of the construction industry and the community.

Any ACT member in good standing, having an interest in the objectives of The Ambassador Club is eligible, invited, and encouraged to participate. Our membership consists mostly of ACT affiliate and material supplier members. There is no additional fee to join the Ambassador Club.

The success of the Ambassador Club depends on you and your contributions. We need your participation in both the monthly general membership dinner meetings and the monthly Ambassador meetings. We understand that scheduling conflicts arise and you may miss a meeting. Our recommendation is that you commit to attending a minimum of seven of the ten dinner meetings and eight of the twelve Ambassador monthly meetings.

ACT general membership dinner meetings are held on the third Wednesday of the month, September through June. Ambassador members are asked to arrive early, around 4:30 pm, to assist in meeting and greeting our guests and new members and introducing them to our ACT staff and Board Members.

The Ambassador Club meets on the fourth Tuesday of the month, every month, from 8:30 am until 9:30 am in the ACT Board Room. This is a time for committee reports and requests, and open discussion for new ideas and programs.

There are four major committees that are supported by the Ambassador Club which in-turn support ACT's stated mission. They are:

1. The Annual Fall Golf Tournament at Randolph Park
2. The Annual Spring Construction Industry Trade Show
3. ACT's Booth at the SAHBA Fall Home Show
4. The ACT Membership Committee

We ask that each Ambassador join and participate on the committee of their choice. You may, if you desire, join and participate in more than one committee. Please be aware that as an Ambassador, you will be asked and given the opportunity to help in all four events even if you are not on that particular committee.
